#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Approve a resolution approving the FY2025 budget for the Arlington Economic Development Corporation.

### **ANALYSIS**

The proposed FY2025 budget is intended to cover the costs associated with the upcoming fiscal year's operation of the Corporation. The budget reflects the anticipated revenues to be received through the .25 cent sales tax in fiscal year 2025 and covers personnel costs, supplies, internal services like legal and finance expenses to support the EDC. The budget also provides funding for potential project investments that could be considered by the Corporation in fiscal year 2025.

### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The budget is funded through the .25 cent sales tax approved in the 2020 election by Arlington residents.

### Second Amendment to the espace Inc. Master Agreement

Arlington Economic Development Corporation

Document Being Considered: Resolution

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Approve a resolution authorizing the Executive Director of the Arlington Economic Development Corporation to execute a Second Amendment to Master Agreement with espace Inc. and the City of Arlington, relative to the establishment of a North American headquarters and manufacturing facility at the Arlington Municipal Airport.

### PRIOR BOARD OR COUNCIL ACTION

On April 16, 2024, following a public hearing, the Arlington Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors approved Resolution No. 24-005 authorizing the execution of a Master Agreement with espace Inc. and the City of Arlington, relative to the establishment of a North American headquarters and manufacturing facility at the Arlington Municipal Airport.

On April 23, 2024, City Council approved Resolution No. 24-108 authorizing the execution of a Master Agreement with espace Inc. and the Arlington Economic Development Corporation, relative to the establishment of a North American headquarters and manufacturing facility at the Arlington Municipal Airport.

On June 18, 2024, the Arlington Economic Development Corporation approved Resolution No. 24-010 authorizing the execution of a First Amendment to the Master Agreement with espace Inc. and the Arlington Economic Development Corporation, relative to the establishment of a North American headquarters and manufacturing facility at the Arlington Municipal Airport.

On June 25, 2024, City Council approved Resolution No. 24-179 authorizing the execution of a First Amendment to the Master Agreement with espace Inc. and the Arlington Economic Development Corporation, relative to the establishment of a North American headquarters and manufacturing facility at the Arlington Municipal Airport.

#### **ANALYSIS**

In April 2024, a Master Agreement with espace Inc. (E-Space) was executed to facilitate the development of a North American headquarters, manufacturing facility, hangar space, and other improvements at Arlington Municipal Airport.

The Master Agreement stipulates several milestone deadlines to ensure project progress. The first amendment to the agreement provided that E-Space must execute a lease for initial existing industrial space in Arlington by August 29, 2024. Over the past several months, E-Space has diligently pursued lease space in Arlington within a very tight industrial market. They are actively negotiating on their preferred site and hope to have a lease finalized very soon. Therefore, the proposed amendment to the agreement extends the deadline for execution of initial lease space to December 31, 2024.

Due to this delay, to allow time for E-Space to execute a lease agreement and complete several other milestones required in the Master Agreement, the proposed amendment also extends the deadline for execution of the subsequent agreements (Development, Performance, Lease, and Ground Lease agreements) to April 30, 2025.

- WHEREAS, the Arlington Economic Development Corporation ("AEDC") is a Type B economic development corporation, created pursuant to Chapter 505 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended; and
- WHEREAS, espace Inc. ("Company"), AEDC, and the City of Arlington ("City") entered into that certain Master Agreement dated May 1, 2024, subsequently modified by that certain First Amendment to Master Agreement, dated July 24, 2024 (the Master Agreement and First Amendment to Master Agreement collectively hereinafter referred to as "Agreement") pertaining to the establishment of a North American headquarters and manufacturing facility at the Arlington Municipal Airport; and

WHEREAS, Company, AEDC, and City desire to amend the Agreement in certain respects; NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ARLINGTON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION:

I.

That all of the recitals contained in the preamble of this resolution are found to be true and are adopted as findings of fact by this body and as part of its official record.

II.

That the Board of Directors of the Arlington Economic Development Corporation hereby authorizes the Executive Director to execute a Second Amendment to Agreement with espace Inc. and the City of Arlington, relative to the establishment of a North American headquarters and manufacturing facility at the Arlington Municipal Airport.

III.

### **Second Amendment**

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT TO MASTER AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as "Second Amendment") is entered into on \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2024 (hereinafter referred to as "Effective Date") by and among **espace Inc.**, a Delaware Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "Company"), the **ARLINGTON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION** (hereinafter referred to as "AEDC"), and the CITY OF ARLINGTON, TEXAS, a home-rule city and municipal corporation of Tarrant County, Texas, acting by and through its City Manager or his designee (hereinafter referred to as "CITY").

WITNESSETH:

- WHEREAS, Company, AEDC, and CITY entered into that certain Master Agreement dated May 1, 2024, subsequently modified by that certain First Amendment to Master Agreement, dated July 24, 2024 (the Master Agreement and First Amendment to Master Agreement collectively hereinafter referred to as "Agreement") pertaining to the establishment of a North American headquarters and manufacturing facility at the Arlington Municipal Airport; and
- WHEREAS, Company, AEDC, and CITY desire to further amend the Agreement in certain respects; NOW THEREFORE

Company, AEDC, and CITY, for and in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Section II.A. shall be amended to read as follows:
  - A. Company shall provide the CITY with evidence that it has executed a lease for space in Arlington (hereinafter "Initial Leased Premises") that allows Company to establish Arlington as its North American corporate headquarters no later than December 31, 2024.
- 2. Section VI. shall be amended to read as follows:

### VI. SUBSEQUENT AGREEMENTS

Upon execution of the Subsequent Agreements, this Agreement shall terminate, and terms of the applicable Subsequent Agreement shall control and shall supersede the terms and conditions of this Agreement. If the Subsequent Agreements have not been executed by the CITY, AEDC, and Company by April 30, 2025 (the "Execution Deadline"), then this Agreement shall automatically terminate and AEDC and CITY shall have no further obligations to provide funding, real property interests, or incentives to Company. Both parties herein agree to use best efforts with full good faith to achieve execution of the Subsequent Agreements by the Execution Deadline. The City Manager may execute a

- written agreement with Company to extend the Execution Deadline. Subsequent Agreements may be executed by Company and/or one or more Subsidiaries.
- 3. Except as modified by this Second Amendment, the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and this Second Amendment shall be binding upon Company, AEDC, and CITY and their respective successors and assigns. If any inconsistency exists or arises between the terms of this Second Amendment and the Agreement, the terms of this Second Amendment shall prevail. This Second Amendment shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas.
- 4. This Second Amendment, together with the Agreement, embodies the entire agreement and understanding between Company, AEDC, and CITY regarding the subject matters therein. Any and all prior or contemporaneous oral or written representations, agreements, understandings, or statements other than those set forth in the Agreement or this Second Amendment are of no force and effect.
- 5. If any term or provision of this Second Amendment is found to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, the remaining terms and provisions of this Second Amendment cannot be affected thereby, and each term and provision of this Second Amendment will be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 6. Company, AEDC, and CITY hereby ratify and confirm the Agreement, as amended by this Second Amendment.
- 7. This Second Amendment may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original, but all of which shall constitute one document.
